

## Episode 4

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

It is important to review characters BEFORE listening to the episode in order to give students an opportunity to pay close attention to new characters as they listen. A set of slides have been provided in a separate link for your convenience. These slides contain a review of character traits. A script (also provided in a separate link) is provided for students who would like to review the text for clues.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Characters are an important element of a story.

- Use the slides to review character traits with class before listening to the podcast.
- Assessment: After listening to Episode 4, have students fill out the CHARACTER REPORT FORM. They can refer to the script to fill in details and found answers.
